


TAKING A PULSE

We are actively talking to communities to better understand the ongoing impact, response, and recovery from Covid-19.

We undertook a pulse check survey in July 2021 with a 10% sample of rural communities across Leicestershire.




Rural Village / Hamlet

IMPACT OF THE PANDEMIC

We asked each community how severe the local impact of the coronavirus pandemic had been over the month preceding our survey.




The most significant ongoing impacts of the pandemic sighted included ongoing restrictions preventing or limiting opening of community facilities, confidence to re-connect, loneliness and isolation, and the loss / reduction in key services (e.g., banking, shops, pubs, street cleaning).

UNDERSTANDING & Applying restrictions

We asked each community if people or organisations locally had faced any challenges in understanding, applying, or maintaining required social distancing measures as we have moved through the stages of the Governments Roadmap.

Of the communities that had faced difficulties, the majority (91%) were rural villages or hamlets. Challenges cited were almost exclusively related to the application of restrictions and included:

- Social distancing requirements leading to it being unviable to open small village halls and facilities.
- Pressure on volunteers to apply complex and changeable restrictions in many settings.





ACCESS & UPTAKE OF Vaccinations

We asked each community they were aware of any issues or barriers to local people getting fully vaccinated to protect against Covid-19.

The overwhelming majority (96%) cited no issues and praised the efficiency, speed and accessibility of the vaccine roll out within the County.



Things have got worse No noticable change Things have improved








LONELINESS AND ISOLATION
