

- 2. **Research-Backed Programme
 Development**: Alison's dissertation
 has been instrumental in shaping
 quality interventions, enhancing both
 their credibility and effectiveness.
- 3. **Groundwork for Sustainable Community Engagement**: We have successfully secured new volunteers and partnerships while preparing our site to host upcoming therapeutic programs that will benefit many.


